DOCUMENTARIES TO WATCH

Documentaries and docuseries have been huge in the last year, and there are some fun, educational options available for you to view. Below is a short list to check out. There are so many more!

You may have already watched every minute of *The Last Dance* when it premiered on ESPN in April. You can still catch all 10 episodes of the Chicago Bulls 1997-1998 championship season on Netflix.

Down to Earth with Zac Efron premiered on Netflix July 10 to rave reviews. The series follows Efron and wellness expert Darin Olien around the world to find healthy, sustainable ways to live.

Amazon's *All or Nothing* is a sports-documentary series that follows a different team each season highlighting the struggles and triumphs of each franchise.

Netflix's *Crip Camp: A Disability Revolution* is the story of Camp Jened, a summer camp for teens with disabilities in the early '70s. It

highlights the need for the disability rights movement in the US.

If you're a music and hip hop lover, you may appreciate *The Beastie Boys Story*. It's a documentary/concert film/two-man play available on Netflix.

Night on Earth on Netflix is a lot like *Planet Earth* but with the lights turned off. The entire series isn't in the dark, as it shows some daytime behavior before shifting to night.

In 1991, a group of eight people sealed themselves inside a giant dome in Oracle, Arizona, where they attempted to live in complete isolation for two years. The filming of the experience has turned into *Spaceship Earth* and is available on Hulu.

Although *Hamilton*, which premiered on Disney Plus on July 3, isn't technically a documentary, it should be mentioned since it drove up Disney Plus downloads 74% over its opening weekend according to *Variety*. 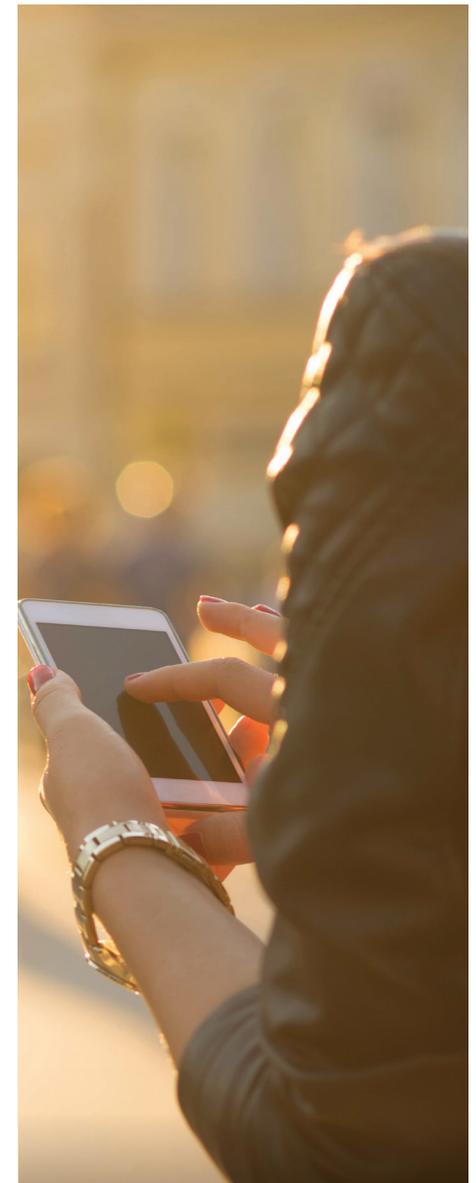

USING TECHNOLOGY TO PROTECT YOUR FAMILY

When it comes to protecting your family, there's so much technology out there it can be overwhelming. We looked to expert websites like komando.com and cnet.com to see what they recommend.

Life360 is an app that keeps you in the know about your family through your smartphone. It features 24/7 roadside assistance, stolen phone coverage, and driver safety alerts.

There is a free version as well as three paid levels. The paid levels add up to 30 days of location history, SOS help alerts, family driving summary, crime reports, and ID theft protection. If you've got security concerns about a location-tracking app, don't. Life360 has never had a data breach.

To go one step further, bSafe is an app where you can tap the SOS button to send an alarm straight to your emergency contacts with your location. Audio and video will automatically be recorded and sent straight to them. You can also set a timer to notify someone when you have successfully arrived somewhere to give them peace of mind.

The number of options for DIY home security have blown up in the last few years. You've probably heard of Ring and Nest but may not know which is best.

Video doorbells have gained in popularity and are a great option for someone who would like extra security without adding an entire system. Next, you'll find two options and differences between the two.

Ring's latest video doorbell features two-way talk, customizable motion zones, infrared night vision. If you subscribe to a Ring protect plan, you also get pre-roll, which lets you view the six seconds before motion is triggered.

Google Nest Hello is hardwired only, so there's no battery option like Ring. It does offer continuous cloud recording with their Nest Aware service. You can also use photos to create a database of regular visitors.

One thing to consider when looking at smarthome cameras or doorbells is if your current internet bandwidth is enough to cover all your internet devices.
