Scams More Common for Seniors

Digital scams are so common these days, but according to the FBI's 2021 Elder Fraud Report, scams involving people over 50 increased dramatically over the last year. And the FBI thinks because seniors are less likely to report the fraud, it's even worse. In comparison, 20% of people over 70 report fraud, while 44% of people in their 20s and 30s report.

According to the report in 2021:

Over 92,000 victims were older than 60.

It amounted to \$1.7 billion in losses.

The losses increased by 74% compared to 2020.

The average victim over 60 lost \$1,800 per scam.

3,100 victims lost more than \$100,000 to scams.

Below is a list of some of the most common scams to be aware of.

Tech Support

Through malicious email attachments or pop-ups on a website, they usually inform the user of a problem with their computer. In order to fix it they are prompted to call a provided number or click on a link that goes to a fraudulent call center, or the link goes to a malicious site that can steal sensitive information or infect their device with malware. The aim is to convince the victim to pay for antivirus software or get access to their computer, which can be costly. Elderly victims account for 58% of the total reports of tech support fraud.

Confidence Fraud/Romance Scams

These scams are designed to pull on a victim's heartstrings. Preying on seniors' loneliness, scammers often target single people with fake identities to win over their affection and confidence. Grandparent Scams also fall into this category, where the criminal impersonate a panicked loved one, usually a grandchild or niece/nephew, asking for money.

Investment Fraud

This involves the illegal sale or purported sale of financial instruments. Usually it includes offers of low or no-risk investments or guaranteed returns. Examples of investment fraud include advance fee fraud, Ponzi schemes, pyramid schemes, and market manipulation fraud. More than 2,100 Over 60 victims reported Investment scams in 2021, with losses over \$239 million.

In order to protect yourself, never give out personal data if you don't know the sender of a text or email or can't verify their identity. Don't click on links or attachments you receive in unsolicited emails.
